



Students' Games 2018 Regulation



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Introduction

The present Regulation aims to inform participants to the 2018 Students' Games about the guidelines for this event that will take place on the weekend of April, 20th to 22nd, 2018.

This document is required to be signed by the delegation representative of each institution willing to participate to the Students' Games 2018. Signature leads to the full agreement of its content and of the consequences caused by its non-compliance.

A few days before the event takes place, all participants will receive an email that will direct them to this Regulation in an electronic format. They must accept it to validate their participation.

In case of conflict, the official language of the retained Regulation is French.

Articles

1. Registration and cancellation fees

Guest institutions have the responsibility to select their own participants. A delegation representative must be appointed for each institution and will become the committee's main contact. Participants must be over 18 and must study at a guest institution under which they register to the Students' Games. Each participant can only register for one sport and only.

Registrations will open from December 1st, 2017 to March 18th, 2018 included. Registrations are online only and the process will have been sent to the delegation's representative beforehand. As registrations are received on a first come first served basis, the organising committee reserves the right to terminate them earlier than the above deadline.

The representative of each delegation must finalise the delegation's registration by completing the following tasks before the ultimate deadline of April 6th, 2018.

- Pay the total participation fees of its delegation according to the invoice received
- Return a copy of the present Regulation signed by the delegation representative

If this deadline is not met and without notice from the delegation representative, all registrations to the Students' Games 2018 will be automatically cancelled. Once all participation fees paid, there will be no refunds.

A few days before the event takes place, all participants will receive an email that will direct them to this Regulation. They must electronically accept it to validate their participation.

2. Participation fees

Total participation fees for an institution are calculated according to its number of participants and the chosen packages.

Full package for CHF 65 includes registration fees, 2-night accommodation in tents, all meals (Saturday's breakfast, lunch & dinner, Sunday's breakfast & lunch) and access to Saturday night's party.

Light package for CHF 50 includes registration fees, part of the meals (Saturday's lunch & dinner and Sunday's lunch) and access to the Saturday night's party.

Consequently, 2-night accommodation, Saturday's breakfast & dinner and Sunday's breakfast are the participant's responsibility.

Transportation to the event location on Friday and Sunday's return are the participants' responsibility. Transportation from one site to another during the event are organized and covered by the committee.

3. Identification

The representative of each registered delegation must provide the committee with the filled document listing names, surnames and emails of all its participants without exception by April 13th, 2018. The document will be sent to the representatives at the end of the registration process. After this deadline, the committee must be immediately informed about any cancellation or change of player.

To confirm the on-site presence of its participants, the representative of each delegation engages in signing the list of all participants previously provided and presented to them by the committee on arrival day.

Every participant will be given a pass that grants access to all event locations and to Saturday's party. All participants must be in possession of their pass during the whole Students' Games 2018 weekend to be able to take part in their sports event and in any other activities related to the event.

In case of loss, participants must immediately inform a committee member who will address the situation appropriately.

4. Health

The organising committee assumes that by registering, participants confirm that they will be in good physical condition at the beginning of the event. It is advised to give up participation to the Students' Games in case of illness a few days before the event.

Moreover, all participants should make sure that they eat and drink enough water during the event. If exhaustion, dizziness or any other sign of weakness is felt during competition, participation must be interrupted or terminated. An Samaritain station held by the Security, Prevention and Health Department of EPFL (DSPS) will be placed on the main site of the event.

In true sportsmanship, bringing alcohol is prohibited on any site of the event and at any time. Alcohol consumption is only tolerated during Saturday night's party. Any alcoholic substance found at any other time and place will be seized. The organising committee reserves the right to accordingly sanction any participant violating this rule as well as the represented institution in serious cases.

5. Behaviour

For the event to run as smoothly as possible, all participants should behave responsibly and respectfully towards each other and towards sports equipments present on every location. The committee expects sportsmanship and fair-play. For each sport, the corresponding Swiss Federation rules apply, subject to changes available in the Sports Regulation for the Students' Games 2018.

Any directive given by a committee member or a security officer must be followed without exception. For safety issues, the committee reserves the right to exclude any participant violating the above rule and, if necessary, to exclude the whole delegation of the represented institution. There will be no refund in such cases of exclusion.

6. Financial responsibility and civil liability

In case of any damages caused to a facility, equipments or to any other element present on the event venues and their surroundings, fees will be imputed to the concerned institution/s. **By signing the present Regulation, representatives and their participants agree to settle charges within the stated deadline.**

The committee also disclaims any responsibility for lost, stolen or damaged personal items. Therefore, we strongly advise participants to bring no or few valuables on site.

By registering, the committee assumes that participants are personally insured against accidents and have a liability insurance. The committee disclaims any responsibility.

7. Accommodation

Accommodation is included in the “full package”. *Quechua* tents will be placed on the main site of the event. Participants are responsible for bringing necessary items for their own comfort; a sleeping bag and, eventually, a sleeping mat.

If a participant wishes to find accommodation on its own or goes back home for the night, but has chosen the “full package”, **the committee should be informed during the registration process.** There will not be any discount practiced on initial package price.

8. Party

The party will be held on Saturday night, April 21st, 2018. Access is granted to participants, staff members and committee members only. The pass given on arrival day will be asked at the entrance.

For safety reasons and to avoid any excesses, participants must follow directives given by committee members and security officers and will drink alcohol in moderation. Restrictions on alcohol are mentioned in article 4. ‘Health’.

9. Parking

Participants who wish to drive to the event are not guaranteed to find a parking space on EPFL's campus. Part of EPFL's Colladon Parking will be reserved for participants of the Students' Games 2018. Booking a parking space is not possible.

Therefore, we strongly advise participants to use public transportation. Thus, taking the train to Renens station and then the M1 metro/tramway towards Lausanne Flon, getting off at EPFL station.

The representative of each delegation must inform the committee on the estimated time of arrival on EPFL campus **by April 13th, 2018**. The meeting point will be given in due time to each representative.

10. Image rights

The committee reserves the right to publish photos and videos taken during the Students' Games taken on the official website of the event. The committee can also use them to promote the event and illustrate the results. If a participant appears on a photo and wishes to have it removed, the committee must be informed by email to communication@studentsgames.ch, by May 27th, 2018.

11. Sanctions


By registering, participants confirm they have read and agreed with the present Regulation.

If a participant violates any of the guidelines hereby prescribed, the committee reserves the right to apply a proportional sanction to the participant and/or the institution represented. The sanction is decided by the committee depending on the severity of the violation and the caused consequences .

A non-exhaustive list of sanctions is listed hereunder :

- A participant may be refused access to the Saturday night's party.
- A participant may be excluded from a sports event, from the entire competition and/or from the event site.
- An institution may be excluded from a sports event, from the entire competition and/or from the event site.
- A participant may be prevented from future participation to the Students' Games.
- An institution may be given a lower quota in future participation or may be prevented from future participation to the Students' Games.
